



TAHOE FOREST STEWARDSHIP DAY

Tahoe Forest Stewardship Days (TFSD) is the League's longest-running community engagement event and Tahoe's largest ecosystem restoration volunteer effort, held each year in the spring and fall. Hundreds of locals and visitors of all ages and skill levels join in hands-on, outdoor work, which can include native tree planting, trail maintenance, stream bank stabilization, invasive species removal and more. Additional ecosystem restoration events are conducted throughout the year with volunteer "restoration strike teams."

2022 marked the 25th anniversary of TFSD, which we celebrated in the fall with an event that spanned five sites – each with its own restoration activity – and included 100 participants, four organizational partners and a half dozen local business sponsors. The work day ended with a celebration featuring live music, food and drinks.

The event was a fitting finish to a productive year highlighted by work at National Forest sites, including an area burned during the Caldor Fire, thanks to a partnership and grant from the USDA Forest Service Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit.
