

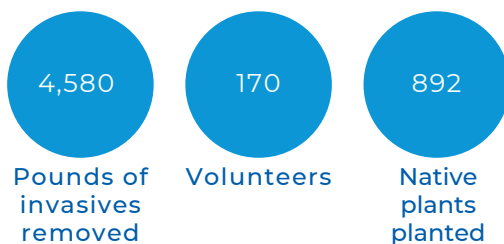
# TAHOE FOREST STEWARDSHIP DAY

Tahoe Forest Stewardship Days (TFSD) is the League's longest-running community engagement event and Tahoe's largest ecosystem restoration volunteer effort, held each year in the spring and fall. Hundreds of locals and visitors of all ages and skill levels join in hands-on, outdoor work, which can include native tree planting, trail maintenance, stream bank stabilization, invasive species removal, and more. Additional ecosystem restoration events are conducted throughout the year with volunteer "restoration strike teams."

For our fall TFSD, 93 volunteers gathered at Kahle Meadows to assist with an ongoing restoration project led by the Nevada Tahoe Conservation District. Participants stabilized the banks of Burke Creek to prevent erosion, built beaver dam analogs to re-establish the natural flow of water through the meadow, and planted native trees, shrubs and wetlands plants along the waterway.
