Key characteristic

 Very small, dextral (right-sided opening)

Habitat

 Silt, sand, cobbles, and aquatic vegetation to depths of 150 ft

Size

4-6 mm long (about the size of a grain of rice)

Shape

 Elongated, coiling shell consisting of 5-8 whorls

Color

· Gray or brown shell
